### Old Business

#### 1. Incident Review – Haily

Incident 16: Committee member asks if we have guidance on allergies. This specific department reached out for guidance but there is no formal policy other than that it could be in the purview of the ADA. If an individual is comfortable they are encouraged to share their allergy with others including details like location of EpiPen.

Incident 20: Speed bumps were installed in the workday so employee tripped when they went to work on a path that didn't have it and then came back to the parking structure on that same path where they had just been installed. Corrections were to give notice to people in area of new installations and increased general visibility of newly installed bumps. Speed bumps in CPF compound are being reviewed to help facilitate movement of equipment like mowers that struggle with current speed bumps. Committee member suggests cooperation with ADA compliance office in this area.

### New Business

#### 1. Request for bite sleeves funding to expand trial- Ruby/Julie

This would be to outfit the remaining teachers of high needs students in Early Childhood Cares with Kevlar based sleeves to prevent or reduce bite damage when it happens. 9 pairs would be needed with a cost of approximately \$250. Committee approves funding for the 9 new pairs.

2. Personnel Announcement: new Occupational Safety Coordinator and Ergonomist – Haily  
Kersey Bars will be the new Occupational Safety Coordinator and Ergonomist and moving away from her current role as a Health and Safety Specialist.
  3. Quarterly Building Inspection delayed to February – Ruby  
Susan Campbell Hall has been selected and everyone on the committee is invited to participate.
  4. SAC Year End Report – Haily  
Required to wait until calendar year is completed before starting, but early data shows this has been the lowest incident/injury year since COVID.
  5. Third OSHA 30 Session – Justin  
Will be in Spring 2026, OSHA training is for general industry but also certification is for life. Cost is \$60 per person
  6. Monthly training information – Justin  
Hazard Identification training is a requirement for being on the SAC committee but it is a one time not annual requirement.
  7. Open up the room to general announcements:
    - Committee member announces that there will be a new ADA hire for just staff/faculty related accessibility. Development of the Physical Access Committee.
    - Committee member notes that “ice season” is late this year and ice melt cannot be used on new concrete for first five years, sand has to be used.
    - Committee member announces dining Services is going through analysis of allergens due to some incidents reported in the past year.
    - Committee member announces funding has been found for satellite field research devices.
    - Early Childhood Cares is diversifying their teams to improve safety in classrooms, also trying to find safer avenues for de-icing their areas due to the sensory learning of students.
    - Occupational Health and Safety notes that there has been a dip in attendance in safety trainings.
    - Committee member asks if we could have a safety course for first aid dealing with high level injuries. This would go through Student Rec.
