### Old Business

#### 1. Incident Review – Haily

Number 20: Crate was supposed to be built a certain way, to accommodate a high lift pallet jack. The crates skids were too narrow and the crate had to be moved manually using levers. Committee member notes that there is a stair climbing handtruck which might be a good resource to borrow in this instance that lives at Spencer View. Committee member asks how many people were lifting (5) and how much is a pallet jack rated to lift (2800lbs).

Incident 30: what is NMR? NMR is test for materials in labs.

Noted that in general we are seeing more reporting from Labs about injuries which is great because it means we are hearing about it.

Incident 39: Committee member asks what was the fix? The sidewalk is city property, but because of the construction only one sidewalk getting all the use, it was a rainy day and there was a puddle which people were avoiding that made a muddy slippery spot.

Incident 40: puddle was gone when investigated, probably has good drainage in the area, just a wet couple of days in a row.

### New Business

#### 1. Wildfire Smoke Program Changes- Haily

Changes to notifications to outdoor program coordinators. Use of WeatherSTEM which is a station installed on top of PLC. This is our source of information when wildfire smoke impacts the main Eugene Campus. Other campuses still using AirNow. OSHA regulations are written in micrograms per cubic meter so that is the measurement that we will be using going forward since we have the weather station. WeatherSTEM also provides lightning and heat index information. Supervisors for outdoor workers will get ONE notification about smoke events which will require them to check on WeatherSTEM. Committee member asks to be added to the list, they work in the Fleet Services Shop because they basically work outside with how much air moves in and out of their space.

2. Training Updates – Justin

Electrical Safety for Non-Electricians and Fighting Complacency are highlighted trainings this month.

3. Open Discussion – Ruby

Committee Member asks about field safety research and how they should find resources.

Committee Member notes the Knight Campus 2 is going to be occupied now. No access to the first floor yet until fully open. Multiple labs are moving from KC1 to KC2.
