Old Business

1. Incident Review – Haily

Committee member asks about lab policy working with mice, what protective gear do they use? They don't usually wear gloves/thick gloves: they need dexterity to handle animals. But it does depend on if they are in a lab versus an animal care facility.

Incident 6: Is this a personal vehicle? No it was a university vehicle.

Incident 16: a wet floor sign should have been used. FSSAC meeting addressed this issue to help managed slips in the time between mopping and setting up the warning signs.

Incident 42: happened off campus at a home visit, that is why the incident does not have a building number associated. Early Childhood Cares provides services outside of Eugene: all through Lane County.

New Business

1. SAC Fund proposal for monitor risers – Kersey

Final 100~ dollars of SAC committee funds request to help ergonomics for monitors. Monitor risers are a high use item in ergo assessments they solve problems associated with meeting keyboard height recommendation and monitor height recommendation; she is requesting 4 boxes with 4 monitor risers each. If the budget is not used before June it will be lost.

It is a best practice to have the keyboard and mouse at a height that allows the shoulders to be relaxed, arms at the side of the body with elbows flexed at 90°-100° and wrists straight (elbow to floor measurement) and the line of sight 1-3" below the top of the monitor. When a desk is positioned so that an employee's keyboard is at or below the recommended elbow to floor measurement, it often has the top of the monitors below the recommended range. Monitor risers are used to raise monitors up to a better position, while allowing the keyboard to remain at or below the elbow to floor measurement. Universally approved by committee.

2. Sidewalk Safety Presentation – Justin

Last time this happened was in 2023 this will be the third time its happened, proactive to help keep trips and hazards under control. Number of considerations for rating and prioritizing the hazards on displaced sidewalk edges including height, depth, slope, direction of hazard, visibility, is it an ADA route, is it used at night, how often is the path used. Spray anything over an inch with high visibility yellow paint. This project allows for long term solutions instead of spot repair, longer portions of sidewalks can be repaired at a time. Please do report any sidewalks that seem to be hazardous, even with this project happening every three years, panels can shift quickly depending on factors like tree roots. Committee member asks if this is also introduced to students who are often on their phones/prone to hazards. No, we focus on employee safety, don't currently have capacity for students.

3. Summer Projects and Events – Ruby

HS Track and Field Competition, Red Bull Chariot Races, NCAA Outdoor track and field, Commencement, Savannah Bananas, Pre Classic, Concert at Autzen, Willamette is getting a new roof, Knight Library will also be getting exterior work done, plus continuing construction projects like Friendly Hall and East Campus Housing. Use UO Map "Construction Impacts" map will be a useful tool to see what is in progress.

4. Review of feedback for Cascade Ramp improvement

People in Cascade annex are all positivity impacted, especially Oregon Hazard Lab and Science Stores who get a ton of deliveries.

5. Training Announcements

Focus on heat and smoke protections, as well as training associated with student move out.

6. Open discussion

Portland based committee member notes that Portland is always interested in more trainings, they just got team boom lift certified. EHS will be up in Portland in June for trainings.
