HAZARDOUS MATERIAL RELEASE

BEFORE

1. Be familiar with your hazardous materials and associated Safety Data Sheets (SDS).

2. Understand your work area's safety procedures and location of safety equipment.

DURING

- 1. Notifications:
 - Call 911 if the situation is life-threatening.
 - If not life-threatening call UOPD at 541-346-2919 and request Environmental Health and Safety assistance.
- 2. Containment and Control:
 - Notify others in the area of the release.
 - Leave the contaminated area.
 - Prevent spread of contaminants. Prevent inhalation of air contaminants.
 - Prevent access to the release area.
 - Obtain the SDS and provide to incident responders.
- 3. First aid:
 - Rinse exposed skin or eyes for at least 15 minutes. Use safety fixtures if available.
 - Remove contaminated clothing and place in a liquid-tight, closed container.
 - Assist others if safe to do so. Use protective equipment.

If you are instructed to shelter-in-place:

- 1. Close windows and doors, seal gaps around them.
- When possible, turn off room air ventilation systems.
 Do not turn off hazmat control systems.

AFTER

1. Review incident. Identify root cause and implement prevention measures.



Ensure materials are secured properly.



Stay away from spills of potentially hazardous materials.



Notify first responders. Emergency 911. Environmental Health and Safety 541-346-3192. UOPD 541-346-2919.
